

EVERY resident should do their part to keep our subdivision as safe as possible. It starts with being observant and taking common-sense steps to monitor and secure your property. Along with getting to know your neighbors, we encourage everyone to do the following:

- Download the hubNashville app on your phone or bookmark it on your computer to report lighting or safety issues on streets that could be hazardous.
 Save the Metro Police Non-Emergency line (615-862-8600) in your phone to report suspicious activity that does not necessarily merit calling 911.
- Keep all doors securely locked when you are not at home.
- Do not leave your garage door open if the area is unattended.
- Consider investing in a doorbell camera or other exterior camera system.
- Leave your front porch light on overnight. It makes it easier for cameras and neighbors to see suspicious activity outside.
- Coordinate with neighbors to pick up mail or packages when you are away overnight. Porch pirates are unfortunately common.
- Do not leave food outside that may attract unwanted critters!
- Lock your vehicle when it is parked outside, whether you are at home or not, and do not leave valuable items visible inside the vehicle.
- Only park on the street when necessary. Streetside parking is a deterrent to traffic flow but also a magnet to those who break into cars.
- Obey the speed limits when driving through our subdivision. Kids, pets, and pedestrians are always around. Keep them safe!

Where did you grow up? Born in Florida and raised in Knoxville, Tennessee.


What are your hobbies? I enjoy the outdoors and camping by the lake and spending time with my fur babies.

If your Spring cleaning plans include making changes or installations on the outside of your home and property, remember that the **Exterior Alteration Request form** should be submitted for any change you wish to make (color changes; major landscaping features; change of fixtures; construction of a new deck, trash can enclosure, fence; etc.). If it is not a direct like-for-like replacement in style, color, and/or material, it needs to be reviewed. This helps maintain consistency in the overall quality of our community's appearance which helps maintain our good property value. The Board of Directors will either approve or deny your project within 30 days of receipt. Contact our management company if you have questions or need the form to submit. You can also find it on our website.

Get on the Hub, Bub!

Have YOU put HubNashville to use yet? You should! Connecting with the Hub is easy. You can download the HubNashville app and access all its features with a few clicks. The website at https://hub.nashville.gov is easy to search and use, as well. You can also call 311 and submit a request with a live operator during business hours. There are lots of functions, features, and request types to submit. Here are some of the most useful in our community:

- Request a new garbage or recycling cart if yours breaks,
- Report street lights needing replacement bulbs,
- Report abandoned vehicles parked on public streets,
- Submit codes violations for neglected or over-occupied properties,
- Report parking violations on city streets that don't necessarily constitute an immediate danger or traffic obstruction,
- Request litter pickup along messy city streets.

A Bit of Mess Toward Progress



As you have noticed recently, work has begun around the Oak Chase entrance to our subdivision. Metro is engaging in a project to extend the sidewalk from Blue Hole Point to Oak Chase and further to Maxwell Elementary School. They will also create a right-turn lane into the school to improve safety and traffic flow there. Our HOA's only role was to give up a few feet of right-of-way. We need to exercise caution navigating the construction, but we can look forward to the benefit of these improvements.
